

## **Product Recall**Checklist



Product Recall helps remove recalled products from the supply chain faster, by sharing real-time withdrawal notifications.

Just follow the simple steps below to register for Product Recall and get the valuable Recall Ready certification status. Being Recall Ready means your organization is prepared to act in the event of a recall.

1 Subscribe to Product Recall

Identify who will be your organization's Subscription Administrator. Have them log on to myGS1 and subscribe to Product Recall.

Within 24 hours, they will receive an email with details to complete the activation.

2 Register Your Users

Manufacturers using Product Recall - Healthcare will need to register two or more users:

- a) an initiator, who launches new recall notifications
- b) an approver, who reviews notifications for accuracy

**3** Complete a Mock Recall
